Read the entire section thoroughly, don't just ask the first questions that come to mind. If the section is 4 paragraphs long, ask about content in the later paragraphs.

In a round-table discussion, you and your classmates will help each other answer these questions. Do not write the answers down while doing your initial research, write your answers while conducting the discussion. You and your classmates will be asking a wide variety of questions and giving different answers. Use empty spaces in this activities packet to reflect and write down notes on what your classmates say as well.

You will have an exit slip / quiz at the end of class that requires mastery of Unit 8A.3 in order to get correct answers. Good luck!
